#### **Kindergarten Orientation**

Our first of two Kindergarten Orientation sessions is taking place next Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> November. Sessions will begin at 9:30am and end at 10:45am. When you arrive at the school, there will be a School Leader and a staff member to greet you and your child at the gate to point you in the right direction for the drop off zone. Parents will be given a take home pack containing information and resources. A recorded information session will be emailed out to all families next week that will hopefully answer any further questions you may have. At the conclusion of the session, students will be walked out to the gates by the teaching staff and handed to their parents and carers.

Part of ensuring we provide students with the best possible orientation experience whilst being compliant with COVID-19 guidelines is to provide a variety of learning experiences for students online. #### Staff Development Days 2021

Each year, the Department of Education allocates five Staff Development Days with the purpose of providing high quality professional learning to our whole school staff. Traditionally, we have had two days at the end of Term 4 allocated to Staff Development Days. As of 2021, the timing of these will change slightly, however the number of days students attend school will not change. From next year, there will be two Staff Development Days at the beginning of Term 1, one at the beginning of Terms 2 and 3 and one at the end of Term 4. School will resume for teachers on Wednesday, 27<sup>th</sup> January and Friday, 29<sup>th</sup> January for students.

KB and K/1R were able to act out and film a short retelling from *We're Stuck!* All these re-enactments demonstrated how well the students listened to this story.


