#### **Presentation Day**



#### K-2 Excursion to Oakvale Farm

On Friday 6<sup>th</sup> November, K-2 students visited Oakvale Farm to meet some of the animals that they have been learning about during informative writing this term. When we arrived, we went on a tractor ride around the park and learnt lots of fun facts about all the animals. We then went to the koala talk and got to pat a young koala followed by the baby farm animal talk where we got to feed the baby goats and other farm animals. Following that we listened to a reptile talk and got to meet and pat some of the parks' reptiles. After lunch we had free time around the park to look at the animals and feed the kangaroos. All students had a fabulous day.









## Stage 2 Excursion to Hunter Wetlands Environmental Education Centre

In Week 4, Stage 2 visited the Hunter Wetlands Environmental Education Centre and spent the day being eco warriors. They investigated how to design energy efficient houses through carefully placing windows and using insulation. They looked at how solar energy works and how solar energy can create power to make devices work, and they looked at how to reduce, re-use, and recycle right to avoid creating too much rubbish. It was a valuable day that tied in well with the science unit "Material World' and our overall theme of sustainability.










## Stage 3 Excursion to Hunter Wetlands Environmental Education Centre

This week, Stage 3 students had the opportunity to attend the Wetlands Environmental Education Centre, where we developed our knowledge of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics) and sustainable energy practices. Students (and teachers) were challenged to harness potential energy and release it as kinetic energy as we raced our cotton reel cars. We explored wind turbines with a different number of blades and different length blades to see which produced the most amount of energy.



Finally, we put a spotlight on solar energy and explored which direction (North, South, East or West) generated the most power and tested which light globe was the most energy efficient by riding an energy bike.







#### Student Parliament- Student Voice in Action

Student Parliament is an opportunity for our students to be empowered students through active involvement in a fully functioning democratic model. At our most recent sitting of Student Parliament, Stage 3 students put forward a number of motions for debate to be voted upon:
